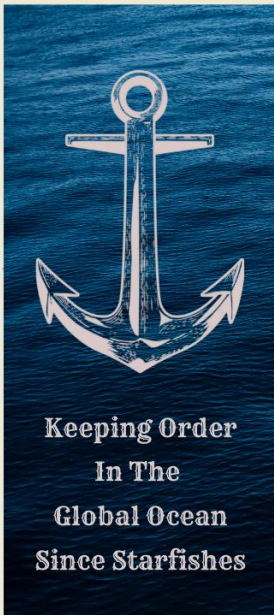


The Global Ocean

The Global Ocean

The global ocean is an essential part of the Earth's ecosystem. It is a mixture of salty and fresh water and has an average depth of about three thousand meters.

The global ocean covers about 70% of the Earth's surface and plays a key role in the transfer of elements, chemicals, heat, carbon dioxide, etc.

It includes all the oceans and seas, and it stretches from the shoreline to the continental platform.

The global ocean has been around for eons but it was not until recently that it became an important element in human lives.

This is because humans began to domesticate animals that live in or near the water. They started to farm them with fish as their primary source of food and other sea creatures such as whales, dolphins and seals as their fur or leather sources.



The Global Ocean's Council
